Over the past half year as your pastor I have been struck by the ways this congregation provides a beating heart for our community, bringing God's love into our lives and then out into the world, and bringing us closer to each other and our neighbors.

When I look towards 2020 I am so excited for all that we can do together. In 2019 we saw new members join and a new pastor get Installed. We continued our commitment to service, participating in the Family Promise Program four times and housing an asylum-seeking family for three months. We expanded our Children's Programming, reinvesting in our combined Youth Group and hiring a Nursery Care provider for our youngest Christians. We expanded our bus route to include Ashton Gardens, so that more of our community can come to church. This is all since June!

Here at Falmouth Congregational we all pitch in and help as we can, and so we are "lean and mean," doing a lot with a little. Still, it costs real money to do good ministry, and how much you give will directly impact what we can do. I am asking you to give generously to your church, in the hope and confidence that God will continue to work through this church for many years.
